

CAPITOL SCHOOL COVID-19 RESPONSE PROTOCOLS updated 7/17/2020

Note: ALL Capitol School faculty will be tested for COVID-19 immediately prior to school opening on August 12th.

What if...?

The Alabama Superintendent of Schools closes all public schools?	WE CONTINUE: The Capitol School is not mandated to close.
Governor Ivey closes all schools and day cares?	WE SHIFT: The Capitol School will move to remote instruction.
A parent reports that they or their child has been exposed to someone who <u>may</u> have COVID 19?	WE PAUSE and SHIFT: All students and teachers in that cluster will go home for 2 days of remote instruction until test results (hopefully, no longer than 48 hours) determine if the case was positive.
A parent, child, or teacher suspects having the virus?	WE STOP and SHIFT: All students and faculty with possible exposure quarantine for 14 days <u>OR</u> until a negative test can be shown. Classes will continue virtually during this time.
A parent, student, or teacher tests positive for having the virus?	WE STOP and SHIFT: All students and faculty with possible exposure quarantine for 14 days <u>AND</u> until a negative test* can be shown. Classes will continue virtually during this time. *Testing should be done after seven days (CDC).
